Royal Arch Masons date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, ANNO INVENTIONIS (A.I.) "in the year of the discovery."

Royal and Select Masters date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, ANNO DEPOSITIONIS (A. Dep.) "in the year of the deposit."

Knights Templar commence their era with the organization of their order, ANNO ORDINIS (A.O.) "in the year of the order."

Order of High Priesthood date from the year of the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchizedek, ANNO BONNEFACIO (A.B.) "in the year of the blessing."

Ancient Craft Masons - (Add 4000 years to the common era)
Thus: 1986 and 4000 = 5986

Scottish Rite - (Add 3760 years to the common era)
Thus: 1986 and 3760 = 5746
After September add another year

Royal Arch - (Add 530 years to the vulgar year)
Thus: 1986 and 530 = 2516

Royal and Select Masters - (Add 1000 years to the common era)
Thus: 1986 and 1000 = 2986

Knights Templar - (From the Christian era take 1118)
Thus 1118 from 1986 = 868

Order of High Priesthood - (Add 1913 to Christian era year of Blessing)
Thus: 1986 and 1913 = 3899

GRAND HIGH PRIEST'S REPORT
TO THE 1986 ANNUAL GRAND CONVOCATION

It is indeed a distinct honor and pleasure for me to welcome you all to the 139th Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Florida. In our presence these past days have been many distinguished and outstanding Masons of our time. Our hope is that they have had an enjoyable time, and by their presence, we have benefited. I trust that we will extend to them the same Brotherly Love and Fraternal Courtesies which we received as their guests. Companions of Florida, let me remind you that this is YOUR Convocation. Thank you for your interest and your participation in Your Grand Chapter activities.

For your information, my representative to this Convention is Helen Waite. If there is anything of any nature, even to the most minute detail that is not to your entire satisfaction, please go to Helen Waite. If there is any way we can further accommodate you, or make your stay here a more pleasant one, please see me or any member of the Convention Committee. All accolades go to Ex/Comp James Ratcliffe who did an outstanding job as chairman of that committee.

Companions, please accept my thanks and appreciation for allowing me to serve this year as Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Florida. It will remain a memorable occasion in my life. To experience the hospitality and warm Masonic fellowship throughout Florida and the Southeast as I have been privileged to do, is worth much more than a thousand reports from a thousand District Deputies, and that is no reflection on our corps of fine District Deputies this year. At this writing I have made over 100 Masonic visits including all 41 Chapters in Florida, and seven other Grand Chapters. On every occasion I have been aware of that bond which unites all Masons everywhere, and have been greeted as a friend and brother. My wife, Linnie, probably remembers most my returning home at 2:00 a.m. from Jacksonville, or Dania, and the 21 hour day the Grand Commander and I spent at the M.W. Grand Master's One Day Class in Jacksonville. But even on those days, the Supreme Grand High Priest of Heaven and Earth watched over and cared for us.

The program of the Grand Chapter this year has been very similar to programs of previous years; membership, fewer NPD's, Youth, Unity, Degree Work, Life Membership, etc. As a personal goal, I set out to present the Royal Arch Research Assistance film, THE LONELY WORLD, in each Chapter in the state. The film is over five years old; however, many Companions had never seen it, and knew little or nothing of our Charity. Companions, I am convinced we will prosper as we help others. The Great Light of Masonry admonishes us to let our light so shine before men that they will see our good works and glorify our Father Who is in Heaven. This principle applies to our response to this great humanitarian effort. It was pleasing to hear from M.E. James B. Wall, Director of RARA, at the South Carolina Convocation that the Endowment Fund of RARA had exceeded One Million Dollars in February of this year.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

There was activity of varying degree in every Chapter I visited. Each is an individual entity in that the level of dedication was dependant on the active participants. However, in each Chapter I found at least that spark of life, that desire to see Royal Arch Masonry prosper, to increase, and to be beneficial to the community in general and Masonry in particular. Each had the desire to make better men of those who did participate. I am pleased to report, that with the blessings of the Companions of Clearwater Chapter No. 45, a group is now meeting in the northern part of Pinellas County at Pearl of the West Lodge, in an effort to form a new Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in that area. Fifteen Companions were listed on the request for a Dispensation to form a new Chapter. On 3 May 1986 they exemplified all four Chapter Degrees. We wish them every success in their further endeavors. (See Dispensations)

During the year 308 were Exalted, deaths amounted to 308, and 261 were SNPD, leaving this Grand Chapter with a membership of 10,990 or 44 less than on 1 January 1985.

Other By-Laws changes and Dispensations were received, but returned with an explanation of my understanding of the Constitution, Laws and Regulations, and a request that the Chapter reconsider their request. To my knowledge, there has been no disagreement, in this regard, between the Chapters involved and myself. Copies of my correspondence have been turned over to the Jurisprudence Committee for their examination.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That the Area Meetings program revert to the District Meeting concept, or failing that, the Grand Line Officers carry the program of the Grand Chapter into each Chapter in the state. Funds presently spent on the area meetings could be used for travel expense and refreshments at these Chapter meetings.
2. Greater utilization of the Committee on Work. To my knowledge only seven of the twenty-two workshops (as required by the Constitution) were held this year.
3. That the Grand Chapter Line Officers practice that Masonic unity which will present a united program of the Grand Chapter. I believe that much could be accomplished from programs of longer duration than one year. This could be called a long range planning committee, if the Grand Sentinel was included.
4. Continue to seek some method of communication with the membership, using the Royal Arch Magazine, the KT Magazine, or our own periodic publication.
5. That the Lodge Representative program continue and be more useful to Masonry in Florida.
6. That each Chapter in Florida have the opportunity to offer Life Membership to all Royal Arch Masons.
7. That this Grand Chapter resume its support of the York Rite Summer Assembly held in Maggie Valley NC that is enjoyed by so many Companions. We have in the past contributed \$100.00 annually.

CONCLUSION

Companions, words seem inadequate to express my thanks to the Supreme Grand High Priest of Heaven and Earth for this year just past. It is the capstone of my Masonic career, and will be among my cherished memories as long as this life shall last. This has not been a year "when I did it my way" but one where by the Grace of God, and with so many others around me, assisting and enabling me, I was able to work for the good of the Order.

Thanks would have to begin with my dad, whose membership in, and high opinion of the Fraternity led me to seek admission. Then the Companions of Sarasota Lodge No. 147 who interested me in the York Rite. The warm and friendly greeting in Lakeland Chapter No. 29 encouraged me to continue, and the blind faith M.E. Companion Joseph C. LeSuer had in me to appoint me to the Grand Line. Men like Tom Morrison, Jim MacDonald, Duane Young and Ed Moore certainly guided me and pointed me in the right direction. Without question, the complete approval, encouragement, and support of my wife, Linnie, has made this journey possible. I would not be here today if she had not been by my side over the years. The unqualified willingness of our Grand Secretary, Howard P. Bennett, has been a strength to me. Without exerting his desire, he has given me the benefit of his dedicated years of wisdom and experience in Masonry.

Surely I have left out many who have made this year possible. Please forgive me, it is not intentional. I suppose the most meaningful thanks I can express will be the measure of support in the years to come. To those who follow; please be assured of my wish for your success, and a willingness to help, aid, or assist wherever or whenever I can. Again, thank you for allowing me to be your Grand High Priest this year. I pray God's richest Blessings on you and that His Grace, Mercy, and Peace will keep you.

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

This report of progress and activities of the Royal Arch Research Assistance for the Capitular year 1985-1986 is hereby submitted. The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida has supported the philanthropy of the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons, International for nine years and the effort has been noteworthy. Our Grand High Priest, Most Excellent Companion Floyd Ziegler re-appointed me State Chairman for which I am sincerely grateful.

During the past capitular year twenty eight Royal Arch Chapters of this Grand Jurisdiction along with five honorary bodies participated in the Royal Arch Research Assistance Program by making donations in the form of regular and memorial donations. The regular contributions include donations made by The Order of Anointed Kings, The Order of High Priesthood, Pentagon York Rite College No. 62 and Joseph P. LeSuer York Rite College No. 80. During this reporting period a grand total of \$8367.50 was contributed, of which \$7712.50 was for regular contributions and \$655.00 for memorial contributions. This is the highest yearly total achieved by this Grand Jurisdiction since the inception of the charity. This increase in participation by number of chapters and increase in contributions is directly attributable to the fact that our Grand High Priest has placed much emphasis on the charity and has made it an item of priority on all of his official visits to the constituent chapters. In addition, we are all aware that Most Excellent Companion Floyd Ziegler has taken the time and made the effort to show the film "The Lonely World" on each of his official visits this year. Through his efforts we are assured that the companions of each constituent chapter in this jurisdiction have had the opportunity to view the film at least once during this year and in this manner become more knowledgeable about our charity. For his efforts in behalf of our charity we are very grateful and express our thanks.

Purchase of Life Sponsor Certificates continues to increase. To date we have issued 243 certificates of which 58 were issued during this reporting period. Our steady participation in the Royal Arch Research Program has contributed greatly to the success of the entire program. I am pleased to report that in national ratings with other Grand Jurisdictions, The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida ranks fourth for general contributions and ninth for memorial contributions. I am also pleased to report that The General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons, International endowment fund for our charity, passed the one million dollar mark in 1986.

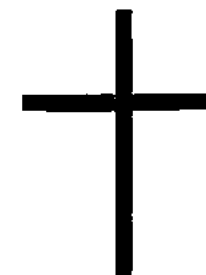

Substitute the following: A York Rite member who has been exalted 50 years ago is entitled to wear the Florida Official 50-year lapel pin that is available from the Gr/Sec-Rec. (See Resolution No. 4, 1984 RAM Proceedings, page 39).

If a 50-year Certificate is requested in either York Rite Body, it is to be supported by evidence from the Sec-Rec and confirmed by the Gr/Sec-Rec.

AMENDMENT NO. 3
(Adopted)

Amend Section 60, Page 56-57 which now reads:

When a Companion Royal Arch Mason affiliates with a Chartered Chapter in this State, if such Companion shall have had conferred upon him by the sister jurisdiction such honors, rights and privileges as are generally acknowledged of a Masonic character, the said Companion may be admitted to membership in this Grand Chapter by vote thereof, and in that event, such honors, rights and privileges shall be acknowledged, recognized and respected by this Grand Chapter as fully as though the same had been conferred upon him in this jurisdiction.

To read: That this Grand Chapter extend such honors and privileges to Past Grand Officers and Distinguished Companions and Sir Knights as custom and circumstances call for on appropriate occasions. Such recognition will be at the discretion of the Presiding Officers, and will include past and current officers from other jurisdictions.

Amend Art. IV, Section 1 to be replaced in part.

That language describing the time, place and selection method for the three Grand York Rite Bodies (Chapter, Council and Commandery) to meet in Annual Grand York Rite Convention

To read:

This Grand Chapter shall hold its Annual Grand Convocation in a Grand York Rite Convention together with the other two Grand York Rite Bodies at a time and place to be determined by the persons who are expected to be the three Grand Presiding Officers at that Convention Time. The order of meeting will be on a rotating basis. Nothing herein contained is intended to preempt either Grand Presiding Officer from taking emergency action to change time, date or place of such meeting for his Grand Body.

Amend Art. III, Sec. 1(a): Delete the words "Grand Chaplain"

Amend Art. III, Sec. 1(b) to read: The following subordinate Grand Officers: the (Rev) Grand Chaplain, the Grand Chaplain of the Host, the Grand Principal Sojourner, the Grand Royal Arch Captain, the three (3) Grand Masters of the Veils, and the Grand Sentinel, whose title is Excellent, and who shall be appointed by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest for a term of ONE (1) YEAR, or until his successor has been duly installed.

Amend Art. V, Sec. 1(a): Delete the words Grand Chaplain, Titled "Right Excellent"

Amend Art. V, Sec. 1(b) to read: The Appointive Officers of this Grand Chapter are not progressive, and are appointed for one (1) year only, they are as follows:

This Grand Chapter recognizes and defines both DUAL and PLURAL MEMBERSHIP as follows. Dual Membership refers to belonging to a Chapter in Florida and a corresponding Body in another Grand Jurisdiction. Plural Membership refers to being a member of two Chapters within the Grand Jurisdiction of Florida. A Chapter authorizing such Dual or Plural Membership must incorporate the same in its By-Laws. This is permissive legislation and affects nothing else.
